SUMMARY OF DUTIES:

The Street Outreach and Intervention Worker exists to provide harm reduction supplies, education and support to reduce disease transmission, stabilize addiction related issues, with a focus on the social determinants of health; linking, engaging and retaining clients to care.

◆ Previous: Twelve (12) months previous experience working with at risk individuals.

KEY ACTIVITIES:

A. Client Service

- ♦ Provides daytime and evening client service, using a harm reduction approach, through a fixed site location and community outreach van.
- ♦ Distributes harm reduction supplies (e.g., needles, biohazard containers and condoms).
- ♦ Safely receives, retrieves and disposes of used needles using a needle exchange model.
- Performs pregnancy tests and obtain urine for STI testing upon client request.
- ♦ Performs basic first aid and CPR if required.

B. Education

- ♦ Provides education for clients on community supports and basic sexually transmissible and blood born infections etiology and prevention measures to reduce disease transmission.
- ♦ Provides education for community and student groups on harm reduction strategies and needle safety.
- ♦ Provides education on use of naloxone when offering a take-home kit for persons who inject drugs.
- **♦** Supports client self-management of HIV and Hepatitis C.
- ♦ Contributes to the development of client resources such as pamphlets and newsletters.
- ♦ Reviews educational resources for appropriate literacy level, content, relevancy and accuracy.
- **♦** Participates in discussions on best practice issues for quality improvement to benefit client outcomes.
- ♦ May show others how to perform tasks or duties by familiarizing new employees with work area and processes.

C. Crisis Counselling and Referral

- ♦ Assesses social and psychological factors, in collaboration with the team and contribute to client care plans.
- ♦ Recognizes the cycles of abuse (physical, emotional and impact of residential schools) and refer to the appropriate supports.
- ♦ Provides crisis counselling and intervention for clients experiencing highly emotional and/or traumatic situations such as suicide ideation, sexual assault and physical abuse.
- ♦ Refers to services and programs to support safe housing, food security, mental health, addictions recovery, and extrication from violent situations.
- ♦ Advocates for clients and assist navigation of health and social systems.

♦ De-escalates emotionally charged situations when clients display unpredictable or aggressive behavior.

D. Community Outreach and Partnering

- ♦ Accompanies Public Health Nurse to search out clients lost to care and clients being sought out as cases and contacts to sexually transmissible and blood born infections.
- ♦ Develops and maintains positive working relationships with service providers and organizations that support the health and social needs of high-risk clients.
- ♦ Facilitates the planning, organizing of community events such as the annual spring needle clean up, Christmas bag donations, and distribution.
- ♦ Participates in community committees by attending meetings and/or participating in events related to needle safety and other programs.

E. Administration

- ♦ Performs clerical duties (e.g. photocopying, scanning).
- ♦ Creates, edits and formats documents (e.g., Word, PowerPoint, Excel).
- ♦ Ensures client notes and referrals are current, documented accurately and communicated to members of the outreach team in a timely manner.
- ♦ Provides input into policy procedures and work standards.
- Gathers data related to evaluation and research projects.
- **♦** Compiles and distributes resource material to support programming and client education.
- ♦ Enters data and use statistical tools for workload and surveillance purpose.
- ♦ Collects, organizes and distributes hygiene products, winter clothing and Christmas gift bags.
- ♦ Stocks storage room, needle exchange room and van with supplies; track inventory when received.
